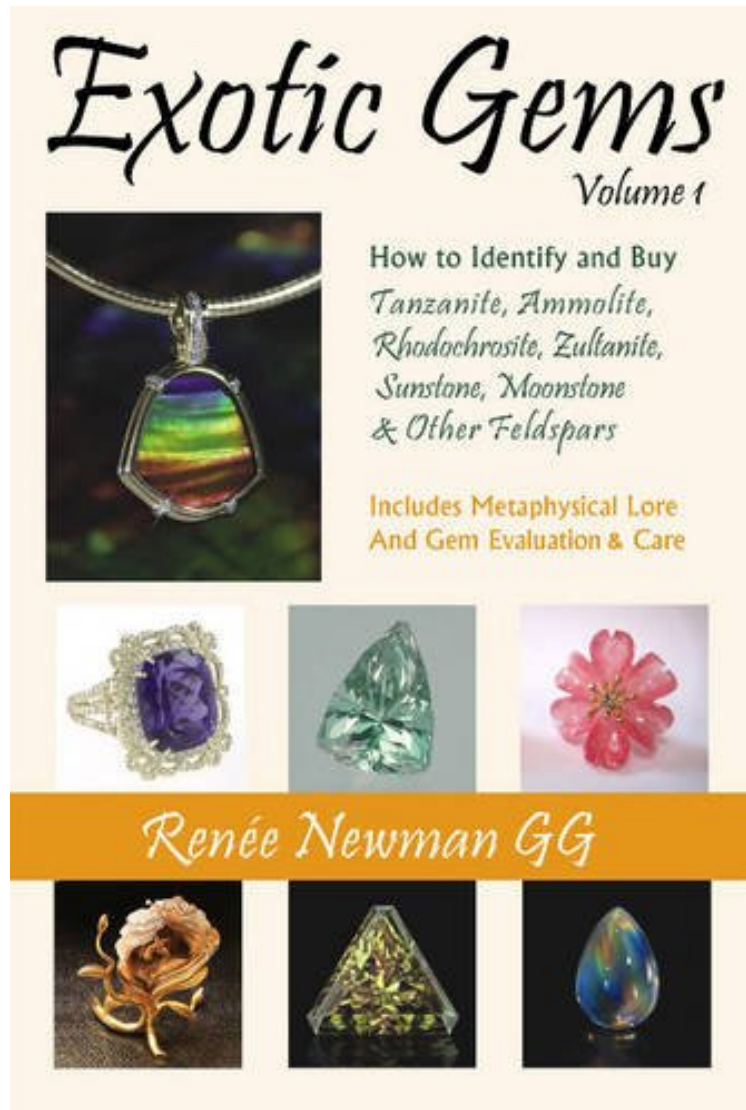

3 of 3 people found the following review helpful. Volume 1 of a 3 volumes, describing gems well and captivatingly. By Mark D. R. Stern. Renee Newman's book is well organized, researched and illustrated. Each gem is described scientifically as well as in a way accessible to the amateur gemologist. Extensive discussion is given to characteristics of any gem and its value, accompanied by illustrations. Only nine rare gems are actually covered in this volume, so much attention being given to each. The book is well organized with a table of contents, and an index. Even if you do not read the scientific descriptions, the brilliant color photographs make it hard to put down. However, as volume 1 you need to buy volume 2 as well which has an additional 15 chapters on related gems. After I bought volume 1 and volume 2 of Newman's Exotic Gems, there were still some missing. I found this in her third book, Rare Gemstones, which covers more of the rare and newer gems gaining popularity. Since buying them, I have never shelved them in my library but keep them out. I may not be able to afford the gems, but I can covet the gems and spend hours just looking at the illustrations. But, lest you think they are coffee table picture books of gems, if I wanted to I could take the time to read the books and understand the characteristics that make these minerals gems. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. This is the first in a series of books that will explore the history, lore, evaluation, geographic sources, and identifying properties of lesser-known gems. This volume has 288 colour photographs of mounted and loose tanzanite, ammolite, zultanite, rhodochrosite, sunstone, moonstone, labradorite, spectrolite, andesine, amazonite, bytownite, orthoclase and oligoclase. Some of the pictures are close-up shots that show how to make visual judgements about clarity, transparency, colour, cut quality and brilliance. A few pictures show how the gems are cut and many others show creative jewellery designs with these stones. The book also provides tips on caring for the gems, selecting an appraiser and detecting imitations and gem treatments. The healing and metaphysical properties of the gems are also addressed. Written for both consumers and professionals, it's easy to read, well-organised, and packed with fascinating information and photos. If you are interested in coloured gemstones, you will find this to be a valuable resource that will help you discover and buy unusual gem varieties you may never have seen before.

Having written guides to buying rubies, sapphires, emeralds, diamonds, and pearls, Renée Newman turns her attention to rarer specimens. *Exotic Gems, Volume 1: How to Identify and Buy Tanzanite, Ammolite, Rhodochrosite, Zultanite, Sunstone, Moonstone other Feldspars* prepares readers (and beaders) to encounter these beautiful and potentially valuable gems. The language is accessible, and chapters including "Price factors in a nutshell" will prove indispensable to novice buyers. The breadth of information on each stone, Renee's guide to choosing an appraiser, 288 vibrant photos and a bibliography also make this book a handy resource for seasoned collectors.
