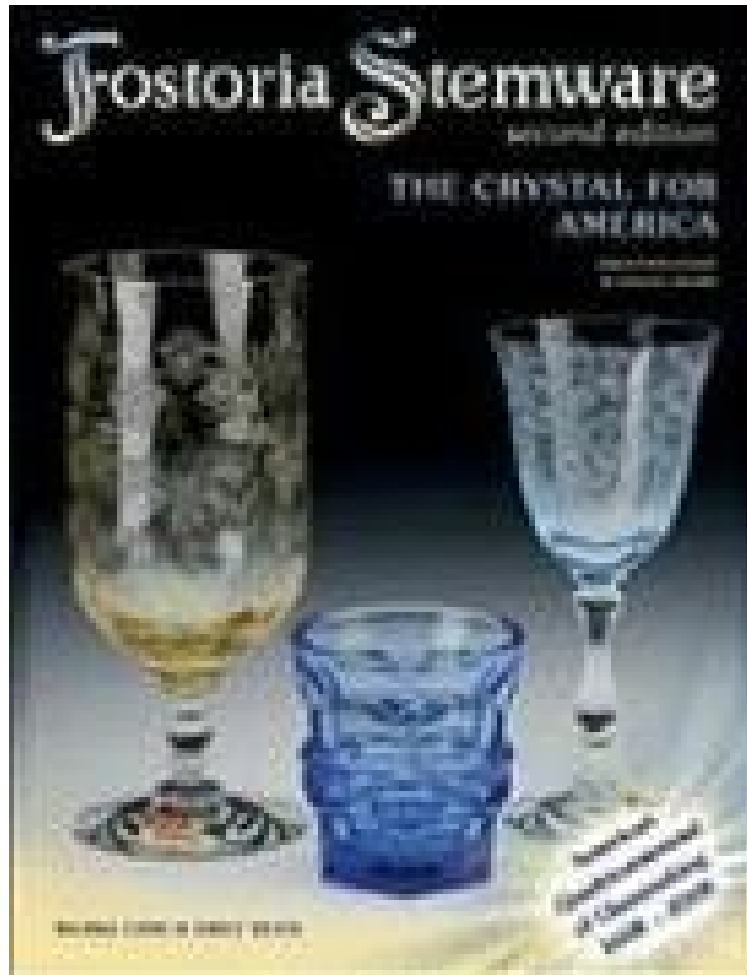

This second edition boasts more than 200 new color photographs to illustrate how a design actually looks on the piece. The same etchings, cuttings, and decorations that were featured in the first edition of Fostoria Stemware remain, but new information, photos, and updated values have been added to make this book a sure bet for Fostoria enthusiasts around the country. The expanded section on the American pattern now shows easily confused stems side by side for comparison. New photographs of tumblers, jugs, and bar ware in the appendices bring clarity to research. Nothing has been deleted from the first edition, but much has been added, including 2008 values.

This second edition features more than 200 color photos alongside original black and white drawings and catalog images. Readers can see what actual pieces look like, as well as what they looked like in original company catalogs. The same cuttings, etchings, and decorations from the first edition are featured, but with new information, photos, and updated values.
