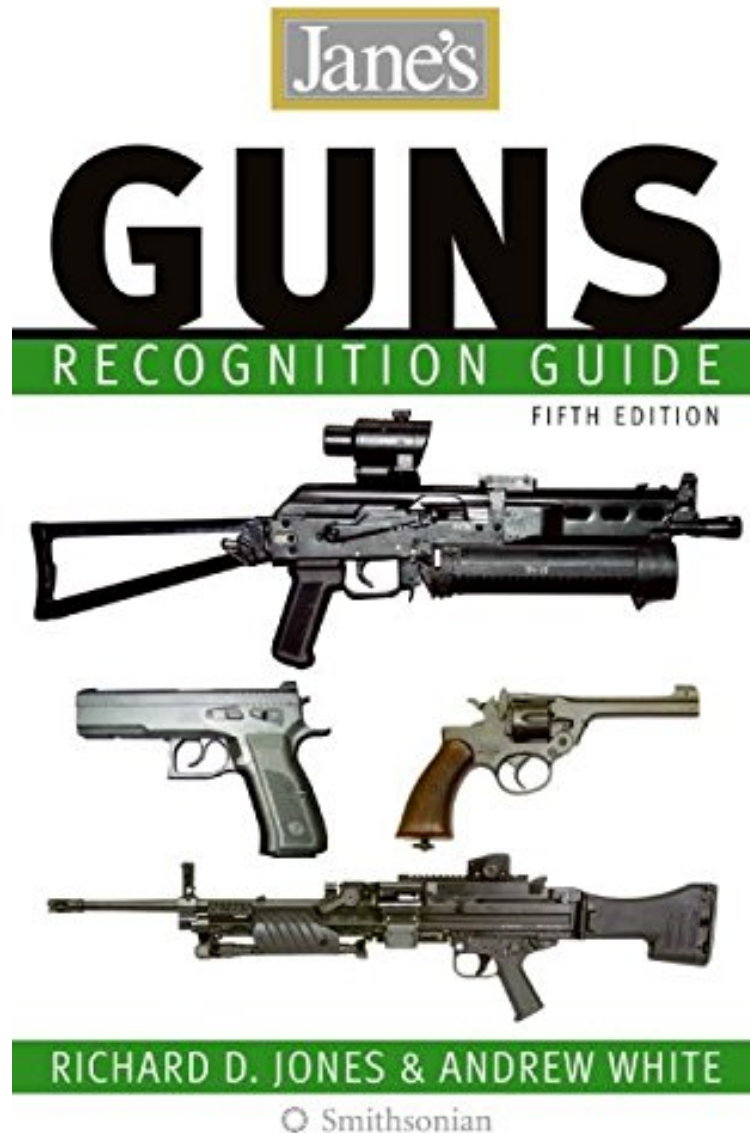

your local gun shop. It does cover a wide range of guns from all over the World and that is great if you are a collector. But for being able to look up a pistol, say a Walther PPS, my CCW gun, you will not find it in the book. Nor will you find the SW .357 Magnum, I carry as a back up gun. This book is hard to rate because it is really one of a kind. The book is neither hardcover or paperback. It is rather a plasticised manual for the identification of arms by police personnel or the like. The book also has much to offer to a writer who doesn't want to constantly use the phrase " He pulled out his service revolver...". The manual offers nothing on shotguns as has been noted elsewhere. This is at least the third in a series and contrary to expectation they have not gotten better. This edition offers no critique which was present in the earliest edition, and the needed correction have not been made. Corrections? Yes, the manual is by no means complete as advertised, and has many small errors that I found: photos that did not match the guns, incorrect dating etc. This is not firearm porn. If what you are searching for is a huge book of glossy color photos done pinup style, well, forget this offering. The book has its place and I keep looking for the newer editions and continue to correct them.
